

DALBY MARKET REPORT - Wednesday 20th July 2022

Combined agents yarded 5317 cattle for this weeks Dalby sale. A mixed quality yarding of cattle came to hand, selling to a firm market across the board. Export cattle sold to a slightly easier trend with one export buyer not in attendance however still achieving strong results for the better end of the export. Cows saw a reduction in price with the leads of the cows topping at 320c/kg to average from 280-305c/kg. In addition, bulls were also cheaper selling from 240-260c/kg on an average. Heavy kill steers and heifers sold to a competitive panel of buyers with many of the secondary kill cattle selling very well. Feeder cattle sold to firm to dearer trend with a competitive panel of buyers in attendance. Heavy feeder steers sold from 470-500c/kg and trade weight steers selling from 490-540c/kg. Lighter end steers from 300-350kg returning to the paddock sold to a dearer trend. Trade feeder heifers sold well, ranging from 430-480c/kg.

The second-round cattle consisting of restocker and weaner cattle all sold to a solid panel of buyers. Good quality lines of weaner steers returning to the paddock sold from 530-620c/kg. Similarly, weaner heifers sold quite well. Light weight heifers sold from 460-510c/kg with heavier heifers selling from 450-480c/kg. Lesser quality and lighter condition weaner cattle did reflect a cheaper market. Open auction cows and calves topped at \$2750 for a pen of middle age Angus cows and calves.
